## Conditions

All General Education courses must be at least 3 credits, must be introductory and foundational, and have no more than one pre-requisite. Normally, general education courses are numbered in the 100-300 levels. The General Education Committee may allow exceptions for 400-level courses, courses fewer than three credits, and for courses with more than one-prerequisite, if the proposing unit can justify such an exception. Some courses may satisfy more than one group (see list in catalog).
